Join us for a family friendly one-time volunteer event to create 'Bundles of Love'!

Bundles of Love (bundlesoflove.org/new-brighton) is an all-volunteer non-profit that partners with community organizations to assist Minnesota families in need by providing handmade items for newborns. Their vision is a world where every newborn has access to the basics. They have work groups across the Twin Cities that sew, knit and crochet newborn baby clothes and put together bundles. A bundle is a bag of about 30 items that a mother in need would need to take her baby home from the hospital. Most of the items are handmade but we also include diapers, baby wash and baby wipes.

This event will be two shifts:

9 to 11 am – 15 people to put bundles together and 5 sewers (must provide your own sewing machine)

12 to 2 pm – 20 people to cut out items, pin diaper bags, cut ribbons, etc.

The age limit for children is 8 years old. Younger kids are recommended for the first shift.





Becoming American:
A Documentary Film and Discussion Series
on Our Immigration Experience
Thursday, February 14, 6:30-8:30 p.m.

Join us for the 4rd film in the **this six-part, monthly series** of films and facilitated discussions about the American immigration experience. It will be offered each month thru April. If you haven't attended, it's not too late!

This program looks at the economic side of immigration chronicling the essential part immigrant labor has played in building America as well as the conflicted relationship American workers have had with immigrants. This screening of the first episode of the Destination America series "The Golden Door " focuses on three groups' histories of immigration to America looking at their reasons for emigrating where they settled and what kinds of work they contributed. Discussion afterwards will be moderated by Professor Olga Herrera.

This program is a partnership with the Ramsey County Library, Shoreview Human Rights Commission, and the League of Women Voters Roseville Area. Additional funding for this program series is provided by the Friends of the Ramsey County Libraries. This is a project of City Lore in collaboration with the Immigration and Ethnic History Society and the International Coalition of the Sites of Conscience. The project has been made possible by a major grant from the National Endowment for the Humanities: Exploring the Human Endeavor.
